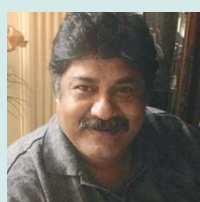


Joint Note from Board members :

The last quarter at the Live Life Love Life Charity Foundation was extremely successful. Nag Foundation disbursed medical charity of Rs.2,30,844 for surgery, medicines and treatment and 3,80,360 for Herceptin Drug. In March '19 the Nag Foundation day care 'Gulmohar' moved to new premises and also did partnership with Surya Sahyadri Hospital. The whole hospital runs the 'Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Jan Arogya Yojana Scheme' and the 'Ayushman Bharat Scheme' meant for below the poverty line patients & yellow ration cards. The Surabhi Nag Research Award was started, to promote young researchers in India. This year, the Foundation and the WCI (of Tata Hospital) have come together and instituted a combined award for research of Breast Cancer. Care India Medical Society reported 6 CA Breast cancer patients and their treatment is done at free of Cost as all of them come from lower income group. Prayas team has conducted 33 Cervical Cancer Screening Camps where 1433 women were screened 36 women found positive and were treated following WHO guidelines. In the month of Mar 19 cervical cancer screening camp was conducted at BMC Software India Pvt Ltd for the employees when 31 women were provided free screening services using visual inspection with acetic acid (VIA) and 16 women paid for themselves for screening with an HPV DNA test. HPV DNA test is the most accurate test for cervical cancer screening. Prayas conducts at least 10 cervical cancer screening camps per month and more than 400 women are screened per month who are also educated about cervical cancer Prevention.

We are in deep gratitude towards all our donors, who have come forward to generously donate for this cause and also towards our beneficiaries who are doing an excellent job.

Prayas Health Group

Prayas - Highlights for January to March 2019

Prayas, established in 1994, (Initiatives in Health, Energy, Learning and Parenthood) is a Non-governmental, non-profit organization based in Pune, India and has been actively working in the field of cervical cancer prevention since 2010. Live Life Love Life Charity Foundation has been facilitating a grant from BMC Software India Pvt Ltd to Prayas since 2016 for cervical cancer prevention. This is now the third year of funding that Prayas has received for 'Cervical cancer prevention programme'. The grant from BMC Software India Pvt Ltd has helped Prayas in screening more than 10,000 women so far. Women who screen positive are provided appropriate follow-up following the WHO guidelines. Live Life Love Life Charity Foundation has provided funding support to Prayas for dubbing of the cervical cancer awareness films in Hindi and for a project on colorectal cancer screening.

Following activities were conducted by Prayas during January 2019 to March 2019

1. Training on cervical cancer prevention: Prayas has been regularly conducting lectures/ training sessions for the doctors from Pune, Ahmednagar, Latur, Ratnagiri at the Health and Family Welfare Department, Aundh who were undergoing training for Population based screening. About 40 doctors are generally present for each Training session. These lectures were conducted on following dates: We conducted 4 training sessions on 4th January, 18th January, 1st February and 26th March 2019.



2. Awareness meetings

The Prayas team conducts awareness meetings for women and girls with an aim to educate them about cervical cancer prevention, and the benefits of screening and HPV Vaccination. Such meetings are conducted during each screening camp or prior to the camp. Prayas conducts at least 10 cervical cancer screening camps per month and more than 400 women are screened per month who are also educated about cervical cancer prevention.



3. Cervical Cancer Screening camp for the employees of BMC Software India Pvt Ltd. on

In the month of March (1st March 2019), cervical cancer screening camp was conducted at BMC Software India Pvt Ltd for the employees when 31 women were provided free Screening services using visual inspection with acetic acid (VIA) and 16 women paid for themselves for screening with an HPV DNA test. HPV DNA test is the most accurate test for cervical cancer screening.

4. Cervical Cancer Screening camps supported by BMC Software India Pvt Ltd.

BMC Software India Private Limited, through their CSR initiative, has supported Prayas to conduct cervical cancer screening camps in Pune city to increase awareness and to provide free cervical cancer screening to women from the low socio-economic group. BMC Software has also donated a mobile clinic van which is used as an onsite screening facility with provision for appropriate treatment in the community setting. Between January 2019 and March 2019, Prayas conducted 33 cervical cancer screening camps where 1433 women were screened and 36 women who were screen positive were treated.
