Joint Note from Board members :

It gives us great pleasure to announce that in the last quarter Live Life Love Life Charity Foundation conducted 7th annual charity gala that was held on Saturday, 12th October at Hyatt Regency, Pune. The event was a black-tie affair with the finest of spirits and a lavish spread to feast on as Goa's leading band Raagas2Riches took a centre stage, along with a Duo performance by Mohan and Koco from Agnee Band accompanied with Mr Jason Leonardo from Everything Expats hosting the Art Auction as well as the evening. All the funds raised from the auction and the donation passes for the event this year are directed towards our NGO's namely Care India Medical Society, Prayas and The Nag Foundation and balance will be used for funding Individuals cases who approach us and are underprivileged. The fundraiser evening is a great platform to bring those who do good together and make them feel good about it! Pune has always been a very generous city and we managed to raise about Rs.99 lacs from this year's fundraiser.

Nag Foundation disbursed medical charity valued at Rs.1,86,341 for surgery, medicines and treatment, and Rs. 57,734 for Herceptin Drug. The Best of MASCC (Multinational Association of Supportive Care in Cancer) conference was co-organized by IASCC and Nag Foundation. The Nag Foundation also runs the 'Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Jan Arogya Yojana Scheme' and the 'Ayushman Bharat Scheme' meant for patients below the poverty line & yellow ration cards. The Surabhi Nag Research Award was started, to promote young researchers in India. This year, the Foundation and the WCI (of Tata Hospital) have come together and instituted a combined award for research of Breast Cancer. Care India Medical Society reported 6 CA Breast cancer patients and their treatment is done free of cost, as all of them come from lower income groups. Prayas team has conducted 36 Cervical Cancer Screening Camps where 1413 women were screened, 38 women found positive and were treated following WHO guidelines and 5 referred to Prayas for further treatment and 1 woman sent for Biopsy. We are in deep gratitude towards all our donors, who have come forward to generously donate for this cause and also towards our beneficiaries who are doing an excellent job.

1. BEST OF MASSC 14th - 15th September 2019

There were presentations on the psychological, social and economic dimensions of cancer diagnosis and treatment. WOMENS CANCER CONCLAVE-14TH September 2019

Women's Cancer Initiative –Tata Memorial Hospital and **Nag Foundation** held their 2nd Women's Cancer Conclave on the 14th of September 2019. The theme of the meeting was recent advances in the diagnosis and management of ovarian cancer and breast cancer. There were stimulating exchanges, valuable networking opportunities, practical insights and better understanding about new developments in BRCA mutation research and treatment options. Prayas Health Group

Prayas - Highlights for July 2019 to September 2019

Prayas, established in 1994, (Initiatives in Health, Energy, Learning and Parenthood) is a non-governmental, non-profit organization based in Pune, India and has been actively working in the field of cervical cancer prevention since 2010.

Live Life Love Life Charity Foundation has been facilitating a grant from BMC Software India Pvt Ltd to Prayas since 2016 for cervical cancer prevention. This is now the third year of funding that Prayas has received for 'Cervical cancer prevention programme'. The grant from BMC Software India Pvt Ltd has helped Prayas in screening more than 13,000 women so far. Women who screen positive are provided appropriate follow-up following the WHO guidelines.

Live Life Love Life Charity Foundation has provided funding support to Prayas for dubbing of the cervical cancer awareness films in Hindi and for a project on colorectal cancer screening.

Awareness meetings and cervical cancer screening camps:

Prayas team conducts awareness meetings for women and girls with an aim to educate them about cervical cancer prevention, and the benefits of screening and HPV vaccination. Such meetings are conducted during each screening camp or prior to the camp. Prayas conducts at least 10 cervical cancer screening camps per month and more than 400 women are screened per month who are also educated about cervical cancer prevention.

Awareness meetings and cervical cancer screening camps:

Prayas team conducts awareness meetings for women and girls with an aim to educate them about cervical cancer prevention, and the benefits of screening and HPV vaccination. Such meetings are conducted during each screening camp or prior to the camp. Prayas conducts at least 10 cervical cancer screening camps per month and more than 400 women are screened per month who are also educated about cervical cancer prevention.

Cervical Cancer Screening camps:

Live Life Love Life Charity Foundation has facilitated a grant from BMC Software India Private Limited, through their CSR initiative, to Prayas to conduct cervical cancer Screening camps in Pune city to increase awareness and to provide free cervical cancer screening to women from the low socio-economic group. Between July 2019 and September 2019, Prayas conducted 36 cervical cancer screening camps where 1413 women were screened and 38 women who were screen positive were treated.





Dr Smita Joshi who leads the cancer prevention programme at Prayas was invited as a faculty for a Workshop on Colposcopy, Cryotherapy and LEEP organized by The Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, KGMU, Lucknow under the aegis of ISCCP & AOGIN India on 15th September 2019.
