It gives us great pleasure to announce that in the last quarter Live Life Love Life Charity Foundation conducted 7th annual charity gala that was held on Saturday, 12th October at Hyatt Regency, Pune. The event was a black-tie affair with the finest of spirits and a lavish spread to feast on as Goa's leading band Raagas2Riches took a centre stage, along with a Duo performance by Mohan and Koco from Agnee Band accompanied with Mr Jason Leonardo from Everything Expats hosting the Art Auction as well as the evening. All the funds raised from the auction and the donation passes for the event this year are directed towards our NGO's namely Care India Medical Society, Prayas and The Nag Foundation and balance will be used for funding Individuals cases who approach us and are underprivileged. The fundraiser evening is a great platform to bring those who do well together and make them feel good about it! Pune has always been a very generous city and we managed to raise about Rs.99 lacs from this year's fundraiser.

In this quarter we are also raising funds for Cancer awareness and its treatment through running the full Marathon by Mr Rahul Chandawarkar and Ashwin Padukone for running their first full marathon to raise funds for the Live Life Love Life Charity Foundation! Every little contribution counts and for every kilometer they run, you can pledge to donate Rs. 1000. Nag Foundation disbursed medical charity valued at Rs.1,46,499 for surgery, medicines and treatment, and Rs.1,79,060 for Herceptin Drug. The Best of MASCC (Multinational Association of Supportive Care in Cancer) conference was co-organized by IASCC and Nag Foundation.

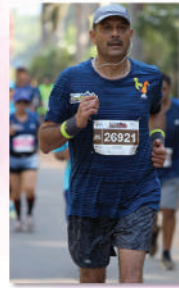
The Nag Foundation also runs the 'Mahatma JyotibaPhule Jan ArogyaYojana Scheme' and the 'Ayushman Bharat Scheme' meant for patients below the poverty line & yellow ration cards. The Surabhi Nag Research Award was started, to promote young researchers in India. This year, the Foundation and the WCI (of Tata Hospital) have come together and instituted a combined award for research of Breast Cancer. Care India Medical Society reported 6 CA Breast cancer patients and their treatment is done free of cost, as all of them come from lower income groups. Prayas team has conducted 35 Cervical Cancer Screening Camps where 1390 women were screened, 81 women found positive and were treated following WHO guidelines and 5 referred to Prayas for further treatment. We are in deep gratitude towards all our donors, who have come forward to generously donate for this cause and also towards our beneficiaries who are doing an excellent job.

The Indian Breast Cancer Survivors Conference

The goal of treatment of disease is an absence of physical symptoms or discomfort. In cancer, however, treatment goes beyond - it encompasses all aspects of wellness to help destigmatize and demystify cancer but often facets of survivorship are either ignored or downplayed. The Annual Indian Breast Cancer Survivors Conference instituted in 2011 was organized to address these lacunae. It is a mix of technical and practical sessions and activities that focus on helping patients and caregivers cope with issues that arise after completion of treatment. The conference has seen a tremendous impact on survivors. From being medico-driven it is now patient-driven with the survivors taking charge in creation, implementation and execution of the conference. Participation of survivor attendees has increased every year. Recommending patients to the conference from different oncologists is noticed. A survivor volunteering as peer support onco-navigator is a positive consequence of the conference initiative.

The Nag Foundation held its 8th Indian Breast Cancer Survivors' Conference in November 2019. The conference is a mix of technical and practical sessions along with activities that focus on helping patients and caregivers cope with issues that arise after completion of treatment. There were more than 300 participants from Pune, Mumbai, Goa, Ahmednagar, Aurangabad, Hyderabad, etc The sessions were planned to address various issues faced by patients and survivors.

Prayas Health Group

Prayas - Highlights for October to December 2019

Prayas, established in 1994, (Initiatives in Health, Energy, Learning and Parenthood) is a non-governmental, non-profit organization based in Pune, India and has been actively working in the field of cervical cancer prevention since 2010.

Awareness meetings and cervical cancer screening camps:

Prayas team conducts awareness meetings for women and girls with an aim to educate them about cervical cancer prevention, and the benefits of screening and HPV vaccination. Such meetings are conducted during each screening camp or prior to the camp. Prayas conducts at least 10 cervical cancer screening camps per month and more than 400 women are screened per month who are also educated about cervical cancer prevention.

Cervical Cancer Screening camps:

Live Life Love Life Charity Foundation has facilitated a grant from BMC Software India Private Limited, through their CSR initiative to Prayas to conduct cervical cancer screening camps in Pune city to increase awareness and to provide free cervical cancer screening to women from the low socio-economic group. Between October 2019 and December 2019, Prayas conducted 35 cervical cancer screening camps and screened 1390 women. During this period, 81 women who were screen positive were treated.
