We are pleased to share that your generous support is helping us make a real difference in the lives of cancer patients through our collaboration with CIMS Hospital and the Nag Foundation.

In the last six months , our foundation has extended ₹6.4 lakh in financial support to the underprivileged patients battling life-threatening illnesses.

Through our monthly contribution of ₹40,000 to the Nag Foundation, we continue to stand by cancer patients who lack access to adequate treatment.

With the generous support of our donors and well-wishers, we successfully raised ₹4 lakhs for Mrs. Sarika Sachin Kalbhor, who has been diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia. This financial assistance helped her continue her critical medical treatment and gave her renewed hope during a challenging time.

LLLLCF continues to support Nag Foundation towards Patient Aid.

From July to Dec 2025, the Nag Foundation has helped patients for various treatments of Chemotherapy, Herceptin (Trastuzumab), Surgery and Radiation.

The Foundation continues to have Breast Screening camps and Awareness Talks to increase the awareness and educate women.

We have provided financial aid to the following with support from Live Life Love Life Charity Foundation.

S.V.J. is a 41-year-old

Housewife with two school-going children aged 15 and 10 and a husband who works as a salesman at a cloth shop on Tilak Road, Pune. When she felt a lump in her breast, she knew it could not be ignored and decisively sought a diagnosis. Her biopsy confirmed that the lump was cancerous and that she would require treatment. The treatment plan consisted of surgery, chemotherapy and radiation. Faced with the financial difficulty of the treatment, she reached out to the Nag Foundation for help. She met the criteria for support, having a curative prognosis and being a young woman with dependent children. The Nag Foundation sponsored her chemotherapy which greatly reduced her financial stress and allowed her to focus on recovery. The treatment has since been completed, and she has regained her usual level of health and functioning.

Nag Foundation Activities for the period from July 2025 to December 25

N.L. is a Manipuri 32-year-old young mother

She is with a 2-year-old child and a husband from Nepal. She worked as a kindergarten teacher but had to give up her job after the birth of a son. Coming from the outside of Pune, her only support system is her husband who works as a bartender at a restaurant in Kalyani Nagar. Her complaint of having heaviness and pain in the breast led her to consult a gynecologist, who referred her for a biopsy. The biopsy confirmed the diagnosis and due to the large size of the tumour a PET scan was advised which revealed a lesion in the lung.

Her fear, anxiety, and initial unwillingness to accept the diagnosis resulted in a delay of treatment and only after two months and multiple interactions with our counsellors was when she decided to begin treatment. Coming from out of state she was not eligible for many government schemes. The Foundation therefore, decided to sponsor a significant portion of her treatment considering her reasonably good prognosis and the fact that she was a young mother with a small child. The Foundation partially supported her through surgery, chemotherapy and radiation, while she is currently continuing maintenance chemotherapy through a clinical trial.

Nag Foundation Activities for the period from July 2025 to December 25

M.Y., aged 45,

She Comes from a small village in Ahmednagar. Married at a young age into a farming family, she has two sons aged 23 and 19. The family's sole source of income comes from the husband who works on their farm, with the income depending on the type of crop grown and the environmental factors that affect crop quality; therefore, their income is not fixed. The patient met the Foundation's criteria for financial aid– being under 55 years of age, having a good prognosis and an annual income of less than ₹2 lakhs. The Foundation sponsored her chemotherapy. She has completed her treatment and is gradually returning to normal life.

N.P., aged 43,

She is an ordinary woman who took on the responsibility of supporting her family so they could experience a better quality of life. She chose to leave her family behind and work in Zambia as a housekeeper. She has a 23-year-old son who is studying engineering and a husband who remained in India to care for his aged parents and their son. She was diagnosed with triple-positive breast cancer with metastasis and returned to India for treatment. Her treatment was mostly funded through her personal savings as her husband does not have a full-time job and the family income is inconsistent. The Foundation partially supported her surgery. Her recovery has been slow, but her determination to overcome cancer has been remarkable.

Survivorship programs are available for both patient and caregivers at the hospitals, (Sahyadri SuperSpeciality Hospitals at Hadpasar, Deccan and Shastrinagar) and Surya Sahyadri Hospital, Kasba Peth and Ruby Hall Clinic, which the foundation is associated with. The much needed Survivorship program has been well received and has helped the patients and caregivers.
